

# **Activity Type**

Grammar and Speaking Game: asking and answering questions, guessing

## **Focus**

Yes/no questions and short answers

Verbs

## **Aim**

To practice yes/no questions and short answers in various tenses.

## **Preparation**

None

#### Level

Pre-intermediate (A2-B1)

### Time

20 minutes

## Introduction

Here is an amusing game to help students practice a variety of yes/no questions, short answers and tenses.

### **Procedure**

Invite one student to the front of the class.

Give the student a slip of paper.

Ask the student to secretly think of a verb and write it on the paper, e.g. sleep.

The other students' task is to guess the verb by taking it in turns to ask the student a yes/no question using the invented verb 'glug'.

Example: sleep

B: Have you ever glugged?
C: Do you glug every day?
C: Do you glug every day?
C: Can you glug in class?
C: Are you glugging now?
C: Are you glugging now?
C: Is it difficult to glug?
A: Yes, I have.
A: Yes, I have.
A: No, you can't.
A: No, I'm not.
A: No, it isn't.

When a student thinks they know the verb, they call out their answer.

The first student to guess the correct verb wins and scores a point.

The winning student then becomes the next student to choose a verb.

The student with the most points at the end of the game wins.
