

Activity Type

Reading, writing, listening and speaking breakout room activity, pairwork

Language Focus

Present simple 'Wh' questions

Third-person singular

Aim

To complete a text by asking and answering present simple 'Wh' questions.

Preparation

Send each student a corresponding A or B interactive worksheet.

Level

Elementary (A1-A2)

Time

30 minutes

Introduction

In this interactive present simple 'Wh' questions breakout room activity, students complete a text about a football player's routine on match day by asking and answering 'Wh' questions.

Procedure

Divide the students into pairs (A and B) and put them in breakout rooms. Send each student a corresponding A or B worksheet.

Working alone, students complete the present simple 'Wh' questions they need to find out the missing information in the text on their worksheet.

When the students have finished, check the questions.

Answer Key

Student A

1. What is his name?
2. What is his job?
3. What time does he get up?
4. What does he usually have for breakfast?
5. What does he do in the morning?
6. What time does he have lunch?
7. What time does the match start?
8. What does he do after the match?
9. What does he do when he gets home?

Student B

- a. Where is he from?
- b. Who does he play for?
- c. What time does he have breakfast?
- d. What does he do in the morning?
- e. What time does he go to the stadium?
- f. What do they usually have for lunch?
- g. What time does the match finish?
- h. What does he usually do in the evening?
- i. What time does he go to bed?

The students then ask their partner the present simple 'Wh' questions they have prepared and complete the gaps in the text with their partner's answers.

When the students have finished, read through the text together as a class to check the answers.
