

Activity Type

Grammar, Vocabulary, and Speaking Activity: gap-fill, asking and answering questions, controlled and freer practice (pair work)

Focus

Christmas

Question words

Aim

To complete Christmas conversation questions with question words and then ask and answer the questions with a partner.

Preparation

Make one copy of the two worksheets for each pair of students.

Level

Pre-intermediate (A2)

Time

35 minutes

Introduction

In this Christmas activity, students complete Christmas conversation questions with question words and then ask and answer the questions with a partner.

Procedure

Divide the students into two groups (A and B)

Give each student a corresponding worksheet.

Working together, students complete Christmas conversation questions with question words from a box.

Afterwards, go through the answers and questions with each group.
