

### **Activity Type**

Speaking Activity: information gap, asking and answering questions from prompts (pair work)

#### **Focus**

Country information

### Aim

To ask and answer questions about countries in order to complete missing information in a chart.

## **Preparation**

Make one copy of the two worksheets for each pair of students.

#### Level

Intermediate (B1)

#### **Time**

25 minutes

#### Introduction

In this countries information gap activity, students ask and answer questions about countries in order to complete missing information in a chart.

#### Procedure

Begin the activity by writing the six headings from the worksheet on the board, e.g. size, capital city, etc.

Next, write the following information about Portugal under each heading:

Size: 92,212 sq km - quite small

Capital city: Lisbon Population: 10.2 million

Climate: temperate climate with hot summers and wet winters

Natural resources: fish, cork, iron ore, copper, zinc

Interesting facts: oldest country in Europe, Portuguese is the

official language

Elicit an example question and answer for each category.

#### Examples:

Q: How big is Portugal?

A: Portugal is guite small. It's 92,212 square kilometres.

Q: What is the capital city of Portugal?

A: The capital is Lisbon.

Next, divide the students into pairs (Student A and B).

Give each student a corresponding worksheet.

Tell the students not to show their worksheet to their partner.

Students then take it in turns to ask and answer questions about each country on the worksheet and complete the missing information in their chart.

When the students have finished, they compare charts to check their answers.

Afterwards, review each country's information and any related vocabulary.
