Grammar Exercises: gap-fill, multiple choice, error correction, writing sentences from prompts, rewriting sentences

Focus

Defining relative clauses with who, which, where and when

Aim

To practice defining relative clauses with who, which, where and when.

Preparation

Make one copy of the two-page worksheet for each student.

Level

Intermediate (B1)

Time

25 minutes

Introduction

This defining relative clauses worksheet helps students practice defining relative clauses with who, which, where and when.

Procedure

Give each student a copy of the two-page worksheet.

First, students complete each defining relative clause with the correct relative pronoun in brackets.

Exercise A - Answer key

Next, students rewrite defining relative clauses, correcting the relative pronoun mistakes.

Exercise B - Answer key

1. where 2. which 3. who 4. where 5. when 6. which 7. who 8. when

Students then write definitions for places, things, times and people using defining relative clauses, e.g. 'A kitchen is a room where people store and cook food.'

Afterwards, check the students' definitions together as a class.

Lastly, students rewrite sentences, combining them together with defining relative clauses.
