

# **Activity Type**

Speaking Activity: forming, asking and answering questions from prompts, controlled practice (group work)

### **Focus**

Modal verbs of obligation and prohibition: have to and don't have to

Do you have to...? questions and short answers

## Aim

To ask and answer yes/ no questions to find out what people *have to* and *don't have to* do.

# **Preparation**

Make one copy of the cards for every 12 students and cut as indicated.

#### Level

Elementary (A1-A2)

#### Time

20 minutes

### Introduction

In this *have to* speaking activity, students conduct a survey where they ask and answer yes/no questions to find out what people *have to* and *don't have to* do.

#### Procedure

Divide the students into groups of 12 or less.

Give each student a card.

Tell the students that they are going to find out what their classmates' obligations are by asking each student in their group a yes/no question.

Each student then creates the *Do you have to...?* question they need to ask from the prompt on their card.

### Examples:

Find out how many people have to cook dinner tonight.

Question: Do you have to cook dinner tonight?

Find out how many people have to wear a uniform at school?

Question: Do you have to wear a uniform at school?

Elicit possible answers, e.g. 'Yes, I do.' or 'No, I don't.'

Afterwards, review the questions as a class.

Students then go around their group, asking and answering the *Do you have to...?* questions.

Students tally the number of people who answer yes or no to their question on the card.

When everyone has finished, each student reports their findings to the class, e.g. 'Four students *have to* cook dinner tonight. Eight students *don't have to* cook dinner.'
