

### Activity Type

Reading, writing and drawing activity

### Language Focus

Giving directions

### Aim

To draw pictures that match a set of directions and then to create directions for a classmate to draw.

### Preparation

Make one copy of the two worksheets for each student.

### Level

Elementary

### Time

45 minutes

### Introduction

In this creative worksheet activity, students draw pictures that match a set of directions and create directions for a classmate to draw.

### Procedure

Give each student a copy of the first worksheet.

Students read the directions on the worksheet and draw a picture of the directions in each box.

When students have completed all their drawings, check their illustrations to make sure they match with the directions.

Next, give each student a copy of the second worksheet.

Students then create a new set of directions.

When the students have written all the directions, they hand their worksheet to a classmate for them to draw.

**A. Draw pictures of the directions.**

1. Go out of the classroom.	2. Turn left at the school entrance.	3. Walk along the road.	4. Go past the post office.
5. Walk up the hill.	6. Go down the hill.	7. Go over the bridge.	8. Walk through the park.
