Vocabulary Game:
matching

Focus

Film and cinema
vocabulary

Aim

To play a game of dominoes by matching film-related words with their definitions.

Preparation

Make one copy of the dominoes for each group of three and cut as indicated.

Level

Advanced (C1)

Time

20 minutes

Introduction

In this film and cinema vocabulary game, students play dominoes by matching film-related words with their definitions.

Procedure

Divide the students into groups of three.

Give each group a set of dominoes.

Ask the students to shuffle the dominoes and deal out five each, leaving the rest in a pile face down.

Tell the students to turn over the top domino from the pile and place it face up on the table.

The first player then puts a domino down either before or after the domino on the table, making sure their film-related word or definition matches with the first domino.

The player then reads the word and definition to the group for confirmation.

If the word and definition don't match, the player must take back the domino.

Play then passes to the next student and so on.

If a player cannot put down one of their dominoes, they take a domino from the top of the pile and put it down if they can.

If there are no dominoes left in the pile, play passes to the next student.

The first player to get rid of all their dominoes wins the game.

The other players should continue to put down their dominoes, as when all the dominoes have been matched they form a loop. If a loop is not formed, then the students haven't matched the words and definitions correctly and they should look for the mistake.

The correct answers can be seen on the uncut worksheet.
