Find someone who's got...

Here is an insightful activity that helps to teach students how to ask and answer questions with 'have got' and write sentences with 'has got'.

Before class, make one copy of the worksheet for each student.

Procedure

Give each student a copy of the worksheet.

Tell the students that they are going to practice asking and answering questions with 'have got'.

Go over the language on the worksheet and have the students create a 'Have you got...' question for each item.

Example: Have you got an older sister?

Then ask the students to write three more questions of their own at the bottom of the worksheet to make the questionnaire more personal.

When the students have finished, they go round the class asking one another their questions.

When a student finds someone who answers 'Yes, I have' to a question, they write that person's name in the second column of the worksheet next to the item.

The student then asks a follow-up question and writes the answer in the last column.

It is important to tell the students that they can only have the same name once. This is to encourage them to speak to as many different partners as possible.

When everyone has finished, have the students write sentences about what they found out using 'has got', e.g. Emily has got an older sister. Her name is Abbey.

Then have the students report back by reading their sentences to the class. Any interesting findings can be discussed in more detail.
