

Activity Type

Vocabulary Exercises: gap-fill, matching, unscrambling, writing answers

Speaking Activity: role-play, guided discussion (pair work)

Focus

Holiday vocabulary, descriptions and questions

Aim

To learn and practice holiday vocabulary and questions.

Preparation

Make one copy of the two-page worksheet for each student.

Level

Intermediate (B1)

Time

30 minutes

Introduction

In this holiday vocabulary worksheet, students learn and practice words and questions related to holidays.

Procedure

Give each student a copy of the two-page worksheet.

Students begin by completing an email about a holiday with words and phrases from a box.

Students then match holiday vocabulary from the email to definitions.

Next, students unscramble words to form questions about holidays and then answer the questions using the information from the email.

Exercise C - Answers and possible replies.

After that, in pairs, students role-play a conversation using the questions and answers.

Finally, students use the same questions to ask their partner about their last holiday.
