

## Activity Type

Vocabulary Game: bingo, matching (group work)

## Focus

Metaphors

## Aim

To practice a range of common English metaphors.

## Preparation

Make one copy of the bingo cards for each group of seven and cut as indicated.

Also, make one copy of the caller's sheet for each group.

## Level

Upper-intermediate (B2)

## Time

25 minutes

## Introduction

In this metaphors game, students play bingo by matching metaphors with their meanings.

## Procedure

Divide the students into groups of seven or fewer.

Give one student in each group a copy of the caller's sheet and the other students a bingo card each.

Ask the students to use pencils, so the cards and caller's sheet can be reused each round.

The bingo caller reads a sentence explaining the meaning of a metaphor at random from the caller's sheet, e.g. 'He is very kind and generous.'

Remind callers to read only the explanation and not the metaphor in brackets.

The caller then puts a tick beside the sentence to show it has been read out.

The players listen and look at the metaphors written on their bingo cards to see if they have one that matches the sentence, e.g. 'He has a heart of gold.' If they do, they cross it off.

The game continues until a player has crossed off four metaphors in a row horizontally, vertically, or diagonally.

When this happens, the player shouts 'Bingo!' and reads the metaphors they crossed off.

If the metaphors match the sentences that were ticked on the caller's sheet, the student wins the round.

Players then continue to see who can cross off all 16 metaphors first.

Groups play several rounds, with students taking turns being the bingo caller and players using a different bingo card each time.
