Interactive reading and writing exercises

### Language Focus

Quantifiers: much, many, a few, a little

Countable and uncountable nouns

### Aim

To learn and practice how to use much, many, a few and a little with countable or uncountable nouns.

### Preparation

Send each student a copy of the interactive worksheet.

### Level

Elementary (A1-A2)

### Time

20 minutes

### Introduction

This quantifiers interactive worksheet helps students learn and practice how to use much, many, a few and a little with countable or uncountable nouns.

### Procedure

Students start by sorting nouns into countable and uncountable nouns.

#### Exercise A - Answer key

Countable nouns: eggs, chairs, bottles, bags, girls

Uncountable nouns: bread, money, coffee, homework, cheese

Next, students complete questions using the quantifiers 'much' or 'many' with the nouns from the first exercise.

#### Exercise B - Answer key

Students then complete answers to the questions with 'a little' or 'a few'.

In the last exercise, students write 'much' or 'many' questions and answers using 'a little' or 'a few' for other countable and uncountable nouns.

When the students have finished, check their questions and answers.
