

Activity Type

Speaking Game: naming, asking and answering questions, freer practice (group work)

Focus

Adverbs of manner

Aim

To name people who perform activities in a particular manner.

Preparation

Make one copy of the cards for each group of three and cut as indicated.

Level

Pre-intermediate (A2)

Time

25 minutes

Introduction

In this adverbs of manner game, students name people who perform activities in a particular manner.

Procedure

Before commencing the game, you may want to review the adverbs of manner used in the activity and pre-teach any that students might find unfamiliar such as *smartly* or *neatly*.

Divide the students into groups of three.

Give each group a set of cards.

Ask the students to shuffle the cards and place them face down in a pile on the table.

Students take it in turns to pick up a card and ask the other students to name someone who performs the activity on the card in the manner shown, e.g. 'Name someone who eats quickly'.

The other students then race to answer the question by thinking of someone who performs the activity in that particular manner. The first student to answer keeps the card.

The other students then ask the winning student follow-up questions to gain more information.


If neither student can answer the question, the card is placed at the bottom of the pile and used again later in the game.

The student with the most cards at the end of the game wins.

Finally, have a class feedback session and elicit the most interesting answers from the students.
