

Activity Type

Vocabulary and Speaking Game: impromptu speech, multiple-choice questions, guessing, freer practice (group work)

Focus

New Year's Eve

Aim

To practice New Year's Eve vocabulary and talking about New Year's Eve.

Preparation

Make one copy of the game board and cards for each group of three or four. Cut the cards out as indicated.

You will also need a dice and counters for each group.

Level

Upper-intermediate (B2)

Time

25 minutes

Introduction

In this New Year's Eve board game, students practice vocabulary related to New Year's Eve and talk in response to topic-related prompts.

Procedure

Divide the students into groups of three or four.

Give each group a copy of the game board, a set of cards, a dice, and counters.

Select one student in each group to keep the time.

Ask the students to shuffle the cards and place them face-down in a pile on the table.

Players begin by placing their counters on the start square.

Players then take turns rolling the dice and moving their counter along the board.

If a player lands on a 'Talk about' square, they talk in response to the New Year's Eve prompt for 30 seconds without stopping.

If a player can't think of anything to say or stops talking before the 30 seconds are up, they go back two squares.

If a player lands on a blank square, another student picks up a card from the top of the pile and reads out the question on the card, followed by three possible multiple-choice answers.

The player then has ten seconds to answer.

If the player answers correctly, they remain on the square. If not, they move their counter back two squares.

The correct answer is shown on the card in bold.

The card is then placed at the bottom of the pile, and it's the next player's turn to roll the dice.

The first player to reach the finish wins the game.
