Vocabulary Game:
guessing (pair work)

Focus

Offers with *will* and *shall*

Aim

To guess missing words in sentences and questions that make offers with *will* and *shall*.

Preparation

Make one copy of the two worksheets for each pair of students.

Level

Pre-intermediate (A2)

Time

25 minutes

Introduction

In this making offers game, students guess missing words in sentences and questions that make offers with *will* and *shall*.

Procedure

Divide the students into pairs (Student A and B).

Give each student a corresponding worksheet.

Tell the students not to show their worksheet to their partner.

Explain that the students are going to guess the missing words in the gap-fill sentences on their worksheet and that the sentences without gaps are the ones their partner has to guess.

The missing words in each offer are *will* or *shall* and a verb.

Students then take it in turns to guess the missing words in each offer and read the complete sentence to their partner who tells them if they are right or wrong by looking at the words in bold on their worksheet.

Students get three chances to guess the missing words and must say the exact sentence their partner has on their worksheet to win.

If a student guesses correctly the first time, they score three points. On the second try, they score two points and so on.

When a student correctly guesses the missing words, they write them on their worksheet.

If the student is unable to guess, the answer is revealed and no points are scored.

The student with the most points at the end of the game is the winner.

Student A

Take it in turns to guess the missing words in the gap-fill sentences that make offers. The missing words are *will* or *shall* and a verb. When you correctly guess the words, write them in the gaps.

You have three chances to guess the exact words. If you guess correctly the first time, you score three points. On the second try, you get two points. On the third try, you receive one point.

The sentences without gaps are the ones your partner has to guess. The missing words your partner has to guess are in bold.
