

Activity Type

Reading, matching, listening and speaking activity, group work

Language Focus

Personal information questions

Aim

To form, ask and answer personal information questions.

Preparation

Make one copy of the dominoes for each group of three or four and cut as indicated.

Level

Pre-intermediate

Time

25 minutes

Introduction

In this dominoes game, students form, ask and answer personal information questions.

Procedure

Divide the students into groups of three or four.

Give each group a set of dominoes.

Ask the students to shuffle the dominoes and deal out five each, leaving the rest in a pile face down.

Tell the students to turn over the top domino from the pile and place it face up on the table.

The first player tries to make a personal information question by placing a domino down either before or after the domino on the table.

If the player can form a grammatically correct and logical question, they ask the question to the next player.

If the next player answers correctly, it is their turn to put down one of their dominoes at either end of the domino chain and ask a question to the next player.

If a player fails to answer a question correctly, they miss a turn and the question passes to the next player to try to answer.

If a player cannot put down one of their dominoes, they take a domino from the top of the pile and put it down if they can.

If there are no dominoes left in the pile, play passes to the next student.

The first player to get rid of all their dominoes wins. However, the game continues until all the cards have been used or game play has been exhausted.

Afterwards, the students can reshuffle the dominoes and play again.

The correct answers can be seen on the uncut worksheet.
