Speaking Activity: sentence completion, guessing (pair work)

Focus

Manners and etiquette

Giving opinions

Modal verbs of obligation

Aim

To give opinions on appropriate behaviour in certain situations.

Preparation

Make one copy of the two worksheets for each pair of students.

Level

Pre-intermediate (A2)

Time

25 minutes

Introduction

In this manners and etiquette activity, students give opinions on appropriate behaviour in certain situations and then play a guessing game where they decide whether a partner would agree or disagree with their opinions.

Procedure

Divide the students into two groups (A and B).

Give each student a corresponding worksheet.

Before you begin, pre-teach some of the harder vocabulary such as *host*, *pregnant*, *crowded* and *invitation*.

Next, students complete each sentence with a verb from a box along with *should*, *shouldn't* or *don't have to*, according to their opinion. Afterwards, check the answers with each group.

Exercise A - Answer key (some answers may vary)

Next, students pair up with someone from the other group.

Working alone, students guess whether their partner will agree or disagree with their opinions and indicate their answers in a chart.

Students then read their sentences to their partner, who responds I agree or I disagree after each sentence. Students score one point for each correct guess. The student with the most correct guesses wins.
