

## Activity Type

Vocabulary Game: matching, gap-fill (pair work)

## Focus

Adjectives of opinion

## Aim

To complete sentences with suitable opinion adjectives.

## Preparation

Make one copy of the dominoes for each group of three and cut as indicated.

## Level

Intermediate (B1)

## Time

20 minutes

## Introduction

In this adjectives of opinion game, students play dominoes by completing sentences with suitable opinion adjectives.

## Procedure

Divide the students into groups of three.

Give each group a set of dominoes.

Ask the students to shuffle the dominoes and deal out six each, leaving the rest in a pile face-down on the table.

Tell the students to turn over the top domino from the pile and place it face-up.

The first player puts one of their dominoes down on either side of the domino on the table, matching a sentence with a suitable opinion adjective or vice versa.

The player then reads the completed sentence to the group.

If the other players agree that the opinion adjective and sentence match, the domino remains in place. If not, the player takes back their domino.

It is then the next student's turn to play.

If a player is unable to put down one of their dominoes, they take a domino from the top of the pile and put it down if they can.

If there are no dominoes left in the pile, play passes to the next student.

The first player to get rid of all their dominoes is the winner.
