Grammar and Vocabulary Exercises: matching, gap-fill, writing sentences from prompts

Focus

Phrasal verbs

Aim

To practice using a variety of phrasal verbs in sentences.

Preparation

Make one copy of the two-page worksheet for each student.

Level

Pre-intermediate (A2)

Time

25 minutes

Introduction

In this phrasal verbs worksheet, students practice using a variety of phrasal verbs in sentences.

Procedure

Give each student a copy of the two-page worksheet.

Students start by matching sentence halves together to complete phrasal verbs.

Next, students choose prepositions from a box to complete sentences with phrasal verbs.
