

Activity Type

Speaking Activity: guided discussion, communicative practice (group work)

Focus

Critical thinking

Asking for and giving opinions

Agreeing and disagreeing

Aim

Use critical thinking skills to discuss a set of controversial statements.

Preparation

Make one copy of the questions for each group of four and cut as indicated.

Level

Upper-intermediate (B2)

Time

30 minutes

Introduction

This critical thinking speaking activity provides an opportunity for students to use their critical thinking skills to discuss a set of controversial statements.

Procedure

Divide the students into groups of four.

Give each group a set of statements.

Each group reads the statements and chooses three of them to discuss.

Students then have five minutes to discuss each statement and come up with an response, noting down the reasons for their opinions and any considerations they made.

When all three statements have been discussed, each group chooses a spokesperson to present the group's responses to the class.

After each group has presented, get feedback from the rest of the class on their views.

Any interesting findings can then be discussed in more detail.
